What is the CV and Lipid Data Capture tool?

The CV and Lipid Data Capture tool is a non-promotional donation to NHS organisations and has been developed and funded by Daiichi Sankyo UK to support the delivery of care for patients with lipid disorders.

It is a programmed Microsoft Excel spreadsheet that provides healthcare organisations (HCOs) with a quick way to securely and anonymously record and pool information relating to their patients with dyslipidaemia and hypercholesterolaemia.

For every patient, it allows individual Healthcare Professionals (HCPs), working within the HCOs, to record aspects of their general and cardiovascular (CV) history, the patients' blood lipid values, other blood test and pressure results, as well as the patients' total CV risk, lipid-lowering treatments, side effects and lipid goals. From this information, the HCO can retrospectively review patients' outcomes from their clinics. This pooled information within the Tool can help inform clinical governance decisions for the HCO.

Appendix: Anti-bribery questionnaire

'Bribery' is defined as:
